## **GROUP 01**

#### Scene 01:

Hello, I am \_\_\_\_\_ with the state code \_\_\_\_\_, A participant in the Film & Photography SAED training program. Today, we going to take you on a tour through the important points and offices within the Permanent Orientation Camp, here in Obubra, Cross River State. Come with me.

#### Scene 02:

#### The Main Gate:

Here is the main gate to the camp which double as the security checkpoint. Upon entering the camp, you will be required by combined men of the major security outfit in Nigeria to offload your luggage for proper search. The team will be searching for items PCMs are prohibited from taking with them such as sharp objects, big electrical appliances, small weapons, laptops among others.

#### Scene 03:

## The Capitol:

The Capitol is the most hallowed space within the camp community as it is both the residence and office of the State Coordinator. As a PCM or Corps member, you may not have so much to do at the capitol except if you have an appointment with the State Coordinator.

Beside the Capitol is also a garden which may be used for lectures. Some SAED training classes also holds here. Behind the capitol are the Catholic Chapel where catholic faithful within the camp community worship and the NCCF chapel where Christians of every other denomination worship.

## **GROUP 02**

#### Scene 04:

#### Hustles:

The camp has several hustles named after individuals and the local governments within the state. The check-in points are usually mounted in front of each hustle manned by staff of the NYSC who will document each PCM and allocate a hustle room. Room occupants are usually at liberty to choose their preferred bed space. As a result, the earlier you get to the camp, the better opportunity you have to grab the best bed space within the room you're assigned.

#### Scene 05:

#### ICT:

The ICT section is the office of the Head of ICT and Head of Deployment & Relocation and its assigned staff. As camp activities progress, registration will be moved from the lecture hall to the ICT section here. Also, application for relocation, and submission of certificate format is done here. Basically, if you have any issues with your registration or dashboard, here is the unit to visit.

#### Scene 06:

## Platoon Officers Stand:

Every successfully registered PCM is allocated to a platoon from 1 to 10. The last digit of the state code is the clue to the Platoon you will belong. Platoon Officers are NYSC staff responsible for other forms of documentation, distribution of kits among others. They usually position their tables at various location and easy to find spots within the camp. After successful registration, the next person you need to meet is your platoon officer.

## **GROUP 03**

#### Scene 07:

#### Accounts Session:

The Account section is manned by NYSC staff in the Account Branch of the scheme. They facilitate the payment of the first allowance given to corps members' on-camp. This first allowance maybe paid in cash to pay to existing bank accounts of corps members. Opening of a NYSC dedicated bank accounts is also done here.

#### Scene 08:

#### The Kits Store:

The kits store is where the kits and other essential materials are kept. It is managed by Head of Store, and a few assigned staff members. Platoon officers may refer you to the kits store to resolve issues with your kits. Apart from this, as PCM or Corps member, you may not need to visit the kit store.

#### Scene 09:

## The Camp Director's Office:

The Camp Director is a very senior staff of the NYSC most often an Assistant Director, who are responsible for the daily administration of the camp. Consider the camp director as the President of the camp and his office is located right here. There are many reasons why PCMs or Corps members would be referred to the Camp Director's office by Platoon officers or other camp officials.

## **GROUP 04**

#### Scene 10:

### Lecture Hall & Registration Point:

Once checked-in into a hustle, PCMs are expected to drop their luggage in their rooms and proceed to begin the registration process. The Head of Deployment & Relocation and his team are usually stationed in this hall. Consider this hall as a multipurpose hall as it is also used for the lecture sessions. About 4 different SAED classes also holds their classes right inside this hall.

#### Scene 11:

## The Mosque:

The mosque is a place of worship reserved for Muslim faithful's within the camp community. There is also the old mosque which is now used by some platoon officers. Some SAED training classes also hold here.

#### Scene 12:

## The Camp Market:

The camp market is the market place of the camp where major commodities such as basic daily essentials, foods, phones and clothes are sold. While the scheme caters for your feeding in camp, Corps members will still have to shop for other necessities here.

## **GROUP 05**

#### Scene 13:

## The Kitchen & Dining Hall:

The kitchen is the section where foods are made for all members of the camp community. It is headed by a senior staff of the scheme known as the Head of Kitchen. The dining hall is the where corps members are served their breakfast, lunch and dinner.

#### Scene 14:

## Camp Clinic:

The camp clinic serves as the medical center that caters for the health needs of the entire camp community. It is headed by a senior staff of the scheme known as the Head of Clinic. The clinic has experience medical practitioners. Corps members with the expertise are also posted here to serve.

### Scene 15:

#### The OBS Stand:

OBS stands for Orientation Broadcasting Service. It is manned by officials of the scheme and a group of volunteering corps members. They are responsible for the dissemination of information within the camp community. They handle production and broadcasting of events within the camp community. All missing items are also to be reported here. If you misplace an item or find a missing item, you will have to report here.
